Ostara reminds us that balance is fleeting, but movement is constant. The energy of growth cannot be denied, and the momentum of life urges us forward.


As the sun's warmth deepens, the earth responds—fields bloom with color, rivers swell with snowmelt, and creatures stir from their burrows to greet the returning season.


Ostara The Dawn of Spring



Incense A Blend to Celebrate Balance, Renewal, & Blossoming life

This Ostara incense blend is crafted to honor the balance of light and dark, the fertility of the earth, and the vibrant energy of renewal.

Perfect for rituals, meditation, or simply marking the turning of the wheel, this aromatic blend captures the essence of Ostara's awakening spirit and the promise of abundance.

Copal and Benzoin provide a foundation of sacred smoke, uplifting the spirit and opening the way for new beginnings.

Violet and Lemon Balm join the mix, their delicate yet potent notes symbolizing freshness, fertility, and the stirring of new life beneath the warming sun.

Meadowsweet brings a touch of sweetness and grace, echoing the blossoming energy of the equinox, while Rose Petals add the essence of love, beauty, and the fertility of the season.

For an added layer of magic, Jasmine Flowers lend their enchanting, moon-kissed quality, weaving dreams and inspiration into the blend like whispers of spring's embrace.

For your blend you'll need:

- 2 parts Copal Resin (or powder)
- 1 part Benzoin Resin (or powder)
- 1 part dried Violet Flowers
- 1 part dried Lemon Balm
- 1/2 part dried Meadowsweet
- 1/2 part dried Rose Petals
- Pinch of dried Jasmine Flowers

Optional: If you don't have access to any of the dried ingredients above, a few drops of the corresponding essential oil will work. You can also check correspondences and make substitutions as you see fit.

 What's a "part"? It's any unit of measurement you choose to use. For example, a part could be a weight or a unit of measurement like a tablespoon. So if you're using tablespoons, 2 parts = 2 tablespoons.

To make your incense:

Add your dry ingredients to a glass mixing bowl one at a time. Measure carefully, and if the materials need to be crushed, use a mortar and pestle to do so first.

If you choose to add essential oils, measure them drop by drop directly into your dry crushed herbs, stirring well to help distribute the oils throughout the blend. Feel free to adjust quantities to your personal taste.

Thoroughly stir all ingredients together well, reciting the following charm as you do so:

By sun and bloom, by earth's embrace,
I craft this charm in sacred space.
Copal's glow, so warm and bright,
Benzoin lifts the soul in flight.
Violet's grace and Lemon's cheer,
Meadowsweet calls abundance near.
Rose for love, a fertile thread,
Jasmine dreams where wishes spread.
With every pinch, with every stir,
Ostara's blessings now confer.
Eostre's dawn, both wild and free,
This charm is sealed—so mote it be!

This blend embodies the fresh, fertile energy of Ostara, perfect for honoring the balance of the equinox, setting intentions, and celebrating the earth's return to life.

To use, place a pinch or tiny scoop of the incense blend on a lit charcoal disk inside a heat-proof vessel, such as a small cast iron cauldron, to release the smoke that carries with it the desired energies. Use it during your Imbolc rites.

Make sure to sit the vessel on a heat-safe surface, as the heat from the lit charcoal disk can easily transfer and cause heat damage to surfaces, or a fire.

Keep your incense in a tightly sealed glass jar, labeling it with its purpose, name, and the date it was made. For extra measure, record the recipe in your grimoire and include the name and date. This way you can recreate the blend easily in the future.

Creating an altar for Ostara can be a simple yet powerful way to honor the balance of light and dark and welcome the fertile energy of spring. You can set it up anywhere that feels right, whether indoors or out.

If you already have a dedicated altar space, it's a wonderful starting point, but any place in your home can become a sacred space for Ostara's renewal and rebirth.

Do you have a windowsill where the sun's rays stream in? Maybe a garden nook where the first flowers bloom? Either of these make perfect locations for an Ostara altar, symbolizing new growth, balance, and the turning of the wheel.

Your altar becomes a beacon of harmony and abundance—a sacred space where the energy of the equinox lingers and nurtures your intentions for the season ahead.



Once you've chosen the location for your altar, here are some ideas and tips for setting it up and decorating it for the season:

STEP 1: Start With Natural Elements

For Ostara, begin with elements that celebrate renewal and fertility. Gather fresh flowers such as daffodils, violets, or crocuses—symbols of awakening and new beginnings. Add a bowl of seeds to represent potential and abundance. If you prefer, dried or artificial options work too.

STEP 2: Add Some Candles

In honor of Ostara's fertile energy, you may wish to include painted eggs, a figure of a hare, or a statuary representation of Eostre, the goddess of the dawn.

You may also want to create a space for a vessel to burn the Ostara incense we created in the last section, as well as a dish for offerings, such as honey, milk, or seeds.

Your altar becomes a place where the spirit of spring settles in, filling your space with hope, balance, and renewal.

If you'd like to consecrate the space and invite Ostara's energy in, you can recite the following charm to consecrate your altar:

Spring's bright magic flows through me.



This ritual calls upon the fertility of the land and the quickening light to set intentions for growth, abundance, and new opportunities.

It can be performed on Ostara itself or anytime during the days surrounding the equinox when the energy of renewal is strong.

This is more than just a spell—it's an act of manifestation, a way to plant the seeds of your desires and nurture them into fruition.

Let's get started.



Gather Your Materials:

- A small pot or container filled with soil (you can also use a garden space)
- A handful of seeds (sunflower, basil, mint, or any plant associated with abundance)


