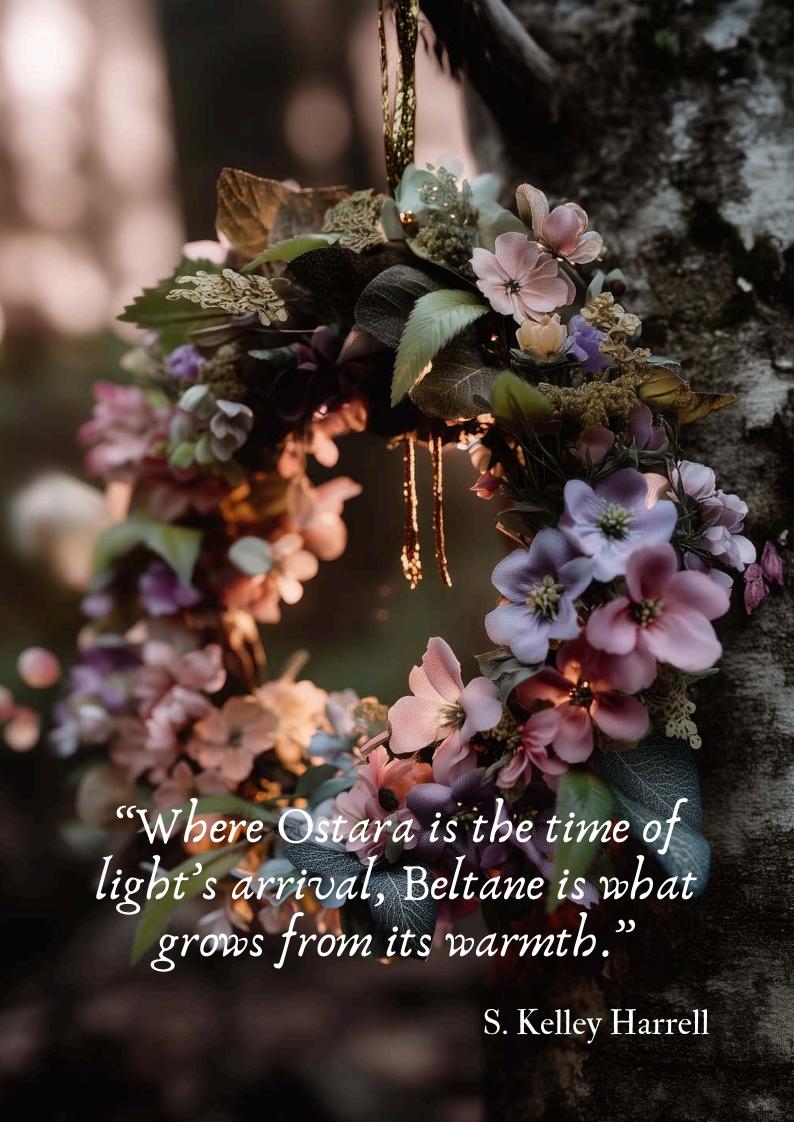
## Beltane A Festival of Fire and Fertifity

## Beltane Correspondences & Symbols

DATE: May 1st

CUSTOMS: Lighting bonfires, decorating with flowers and ribbons, engaging in activities that symbolize the union of opposites and the fertility of the land, May Pole Dance, planting seeds, games of pleasure.

FOCUS INTENT: Fertility, renewal, nurturing goals, and the coming of Summer.

ELEMENT: Fire

TAROT CARDS: The Lovers, Ace of Wands

DIETIES: Flower Goddesses, Divine Couples, Deities of the Hunt, Aphrodite, Artemis, Bast, Diana, Faunus, Flora, Maia, Pan, the Horned God, Venus, all Gods/Goddesses who preside over fertility.

HERBS: Mint, Mugwort, Thyme, Yarrow

FOODS: Wine, Dairy, Breads, Grains, Cherries, Strawberries

CRYSTALS: Emerald, Malachite, Carnelian, Rose Quartz

ANIMALS: Dove, Honeybee, Goat, Swallow, Swan, Lynx

FLOWERS: Primrose, Hawthorn, Lilac, Violet, Lavender

COLORS: Green, Soft Pink/Lilac, Blue, Yellow, Red, Brown

SYMBOLS: May Pole, Basket, Flower Crown

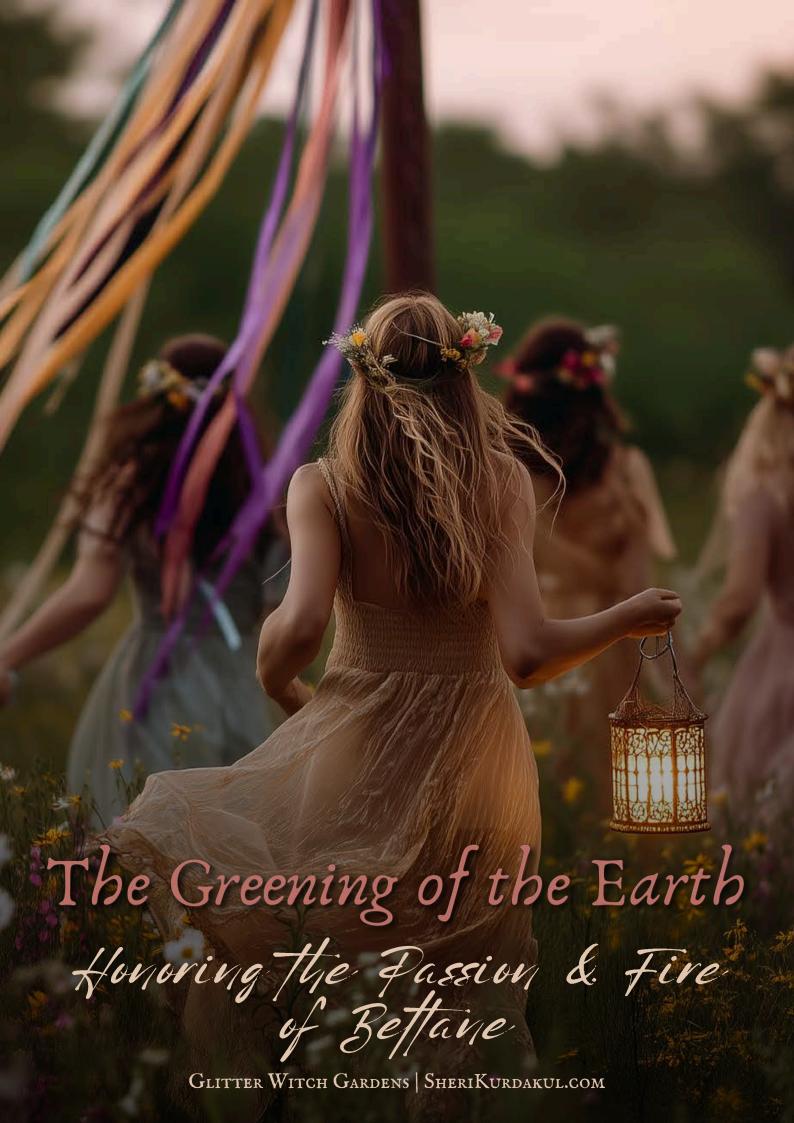

DIVINATION: Seek guidance on matters of love, creativity, and personal power. Try flower-based oracle readings, romantic tarot spreads, or even walk a nature path with the intent to read the signs and symbols gifted by the earth.

## Beltane Ways You Can Cefebrate

JOURNALING: Reflect on what lights you up. What passions are ready to be pursued? What dreams are blooming within you? Use this time to write about what you wish to create, connect with, or call in as you step into the wild-hearted energy of Beltane.

Here's how to set the stage for your Beltane magic:

## STEP 1: Choose Your Altar Space

Select a spot that feels vibrant and alive—this could be a tabletop, windowsill, outdoor garden nook, or even a blanket in the grass beneath a tree. Beltane is about celebration and connection, so choose a space that invites beauty and presence.

If you're setting up indoors, consider opening a window to let in the breeze—Beltane is deeply connected to both the Element of Fire and the Element of Air.

## STEP 2: Dress the Altar in Seasonal Color

Decorate your altar with cloths, scarves, or natural materials in Beltane's traditional colors:

## Beltane The Blosson Charm of Fire & Ferlifity

As spring reaches her fever pitch and the land thrums with life, it's time to craft a charm infused with the essence of Beltane—no ordinary bouquet, but a magical talisman woven with blossoms, firelight, and desire.

This is a spell for growth, beauty, passion, and creation—whether you're calling in romantic love, a creative spark, or simply syncing your own rhythms to the wild heartbeat of the earth.

### You'll need:

- Fresh flowers or greenery (wildflowers, rose, hawthorn, daisies, or anything in bloom)
- Red or pink ribbon or twine
- A tealight or small candle (red, gold, or white are ideal)

## Incense

A Bettaine Blend for Fire, Fertifity & Howeving Magic

As the wheel turns to Beltane and the veil between the mortal world and the Fae realm shimmers thin, it's time to craft a blend of incense that stirs passion, honors the fire within, and calls forth blessings from nature's wild, fertile heart.

While you can absolutely find pre-blended Beltane incense, creating your own blend by hand imbues the work with your energy, desire, and intention—turning a simple act of mixing herbs into a sacred rite.

This aromatic blend ignites Beltane's essence: sensuality, abundance, joy, and connection. Its smoke becomes both offering and invocation—calling forth life, passion, and pleasure.

## Magical Ingredients & Their Meanings

## Rose Petals:

Symbolic of love in all forms—romantic, sensual, divine, and self-love. Rose is a sacred flower of the Goddess and encourages the blossoming of the heart.

## Hawthorn Berries or Blossoms (dried):

A traditional Beltane plant associated with fertility, protection, and the Fae. Hawthorn bridges the worlds of magic and mortal, heart and hearth.

### Damiana:

A powerful aphrodisiac herb often used in love magic and to stimulate creativity, joy, and erotic energy. Damiana's spicy-sweet scent ignites inner fire.

### Cinnamon:

Brings heat and energy to the blend. It's tied to passion, courage, vitality, and purification—plus it enhances the power of other ingredients.

## Dried Orange Peel:

A solar herb filled with joy and brightness. Orange brings in abundance, happiness, and creative inspiration.

## Frankincense:

Raises the spiritual vibration of your ritual. Used to consecrate space, invoke sacred presence, and amplify intent.

## Lavender:

A harmonizing herb that soothes the heart, opens intuitive pathways, and strengthens spiritual connection—particularly when working with the Fae.

## For your blend you'll need:

- 3 parts dried Rose petals
- 2 parts dried Hawthorn blossoms or berries
- 1 part dried Damiana
- 2 parts crushed Cinnamon sticks
- 1 part dried Orange peel
- 2 parts dried Lavender
- 2 parts Frankincense resin (ground, or use powdered form)

## Optional essential oils:

- 10 drops Rose essential oil
- 8 drops Sweet Orange essential oil
- 5 drops Patchouli or Ylang Ylang essential oil (for added sensuality)

What's a "part"? It's any unit of measurement you choose to use. For example, a part could be a weight or a unit of measurement like a tablespoon. So if you're using tablespoons, 2 parts = 2 tablespoons.

## How to Craft Your Blend

## Begin with Intention:

As you gather your ingredients, set your space. Light a candle, play music that feels alive and lush, or open a window to let in Beltane's breeze. Let your energy rise like the season.

## Blend the Dry Ingredients:

Add each herb one at a time into a bowl. If needed, use a mortar and pestle to gently grind tougher ingredients like cinnamon or frankincense. As you blend, whisper the purpose of each herb aloud, breathing your desire into the mixture.

## Add Essential Oils (optional):

If using oils, drop them in slowly, stirring thoroughly after each addition. Allow the scent to grow with each swirl, like Beltane's fire building in the dusk.

## State Your Spell:

As you stir the mixture, speak this charm to seal your intent:

Beltane fire, Beltane bloom,
Let passion rise and joy resume.
By blossom's blush and dancing flame,
Abundance flows—I call it by name.
Fertile earth and spirit bright,
Bless this blend with Beltane's light.

## How to Use Your Incense

TPlace a pinch of your Beltane incense on a lit charcoal disc inside a heat-safe vessel like a small cauldron or incense burner.

Let the smoke rise during your Beltane rites—whether you're dancing around a candle flame, weaving a flower crown, or meditating on desire.

The fragrant cloud becomes a sacred offering to your intentions, to the Fae, to the fire of life that runs through all things.

## Storing Your Blend

Store your incense in a glass jar with a tightly sealed lid. Label it with the name of the blend, its purpose, and the date it was crafted.

For future reference, make sure you record the recipe in your grimoire or Book of Shadows, along with any results or insights that arose during use.

This way, the wisdom and magic can be revisited year after year —just like the roots of a Hawthorn tree, planted under a Beltane moon.

RED: Passion, Sacred Union, Vitality, Sexual Energy, Fire Element, Fertility, Courage

ORANGE: Creative Energy, Joy, Playfulness, Attraction, Sacred Mischief, Confidence, Spark of Desire

SUNNY YELLOW: Happiness, Optimism, Air Element, Communication, Inspiration, Connection to Solar Deities

METALLIC GOLD: Divine Masculine, The Sun God, Prosperity, Radiance, Sacred Fire, Success, Amplification of Power

BRIGHT GREEN: Fertility, Abundance, Earth Element, Love of Nature, The Green Man, Growth, Prosperous New Beginnings

PINK: Romantic Love, Self-Love, Tenderness, Pleasure, Heart-Centered Magic, Sensual Connection

SKY BLUE: Peaceful Love, Clarity, Truth in Relationships, Emotional Openness, Blessings of the Fae

WHITE: Purity, Fresh Starts, Beltane Dew Magic, Maiden Energy, Fertility, Full Moon Blessings

COPPER / BRONZE: Earthy Passion, Hearth Magic, Attraction, Grounded Sensuality, Spark of Fire in Form

BURGUNDY: Deep Desire, Sacred Fire Within, Sexual Magnetism, Life Force, Intoxication of Love

LAVENDER or LIGHT PURPLE: Faery Sight, Intuition, Dreamy Romance, Spiritual Seduction, Alignment of Body & Spirit

BLACK: Protection, Warding Off Unwanted Energies, Banishing Blockages, Defending Sacred Boundaries (use sparingly during Beltane, a season of invitation, not withdrawal)













Flame & Flower

Use this spread to explore what is blossoming in your life, what desires call to be honored, and how to align yourself with the wild, sacred rhythms of the season.



1) What is blooming within me?

Uncover the gift, talent, or desire that is ready to emerge. Example: A creative project you've kept on the back burner, or a part of yourself craving more visibility.

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2) What desires need to be honored?

Tune into what you truly long for—emotionally, spiritually, sensually. Example: A craving for deeper connection, physical touch, or unapologetic self-expression.

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3) What blocks my joy and vitality?

Reveal the habits, beliefs, or fears that keep you from fully embracing your passion and power. Example: Fear of being "too much," people-pleasing, or lingering shame around pleasure.

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# Beltane Tarof or Pracle Spread

4) What or who am I being invited to unite with? Explore the energies, people, or aspects of yourself that are ready for sacred union. Example: A new collaboration, a romantic relationship, or a reconciliation with your inner masculine/feminine balance.

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# Beltane Tarot or Oracle Spread

Receive guidance for living boldly, creatively, and in alignment with your desires. Example: A daily ritual to awaken your senses, a creative challenge, or stepping into a leadership role.

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## What is coming into full bloom within me right now?

Reflect on the parts of yourself that are ready to be seen, shared, and celebrated. Example: You might feel more confident in your voice, or notice a project or personal transformation finally taking shape.

# What desires have I been quieting, and how might I honor them?

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### Where am I playing small or withholding my joy?

Examine where you've dimmed your light, denied yourself pleasure, or prioritized fear over freedom. Example: Saying no to experiences that actually excite you because they feel "too bold" or "not practical."

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#### What relationships or energies in my life are ready to be nurtured or united?

Explore connections—romantic, platonic, creative, or internal—that feel ripe for deeper alignment. Example: You may feel called to recommit to your spiritual practice or collaborate with someone who inspires you.

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### How can I embody more passion, presence, and play in my daily life?

Dream up ways to bring Beltane's fire into your routines, relationships, and rituals. Example: Dancing every morning, wearing clothes that make you feel good, or creating without perfectionism.

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
